CHARACTERISTICS OF WORK

Under the supervision of the District Equipment Supervisor, Pavement Profiling Job Superintendent, or Division Head of Equipment and Procurement, this position is responsible for operating a truck with a lowboy or float trailer to move supplies and/or heavy construction equipment over state highways.

EXAMPLES OF WORK

The following examples are intended only as illustrations of various types of work performed. No attempt is made to be exhaustive. Related, similar, or other logical duties are performed as assigned. The Department may require employees to perform functions beyond those contained in job descriptions. The Department may modify job descriptions based on Department needs. The Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department is an "at will" employer.

- Transport supplies or heavy equipment within the District.
- Transport equipment and supplies to other Districts and the Central Office.
- Load and unload equipment.
- Perform preventive maintenance to assigned vehicles.
- Perform other various duties as needed.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

Ability to adequately operate all types of equipment used by the District in order to safely load and unload the equipment. Ability, knowledge, and experience to safely operate tractor/lowboy trailer equipment. Must be able to operate a wrecker, including winch line and block and tackle. Familiarity with street and highway names/numbers in the work area. Ability to read and speak the English language sufficiently to converse with the general public, to understand highway traffic signs and signals in the English language, and to respond to official inquiries, and to make entries on reports and records. Valid Class A commercial driver's license with tanker ("N") endorsement. Pre-employment drug test required and subject to additional drug/alcohol testing according to the provisions of the AHTD Drug and Alcohol Testing Program.

ADDITIONAL MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS – PAVEMENT PROFILING SECTION, MAINTENANCE

The educational equivalent to a high school diploma. Constant statewide travel.

ADDITIONAL MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS – DISTRICT FOUR

Thorough knowledge of regulations regarding the operation of commercial vehicles and commercial driver's license road test procedures. The ability to communicate in the English language to train other employees in the operation of commercial vehicles to prepare them for testing to obtain their commercial driver's licenses.
