## AHTD Crew Discovers Injured Motorcyclist

Paul Pratt, a crew member in District 4, and his crew had just pulled over to the side of an Interstate 540 exit ramp in Washington County to fix a stop sign when a shiny piece of chrome in the grass caught their attention.

Down the embankment, hidden from view off the roadway, lay Joey Faubus near his wrecked motorcycle. He had lost control of it and wrecked some 40 hours earlier as he traveled toward Fayetteville to visit friends. He lay in the tall grass with a broken neck until the AHTD crew discovered him.

Once they climbed down the embankment they realized they had happened upon a crash site.

“It’s unreal that nobody saw him,” Pratt stated.

“He was just hidden in that grass,” added crewman Stan Bates. “It took us walking right up on him to see him.”

At first, the AHTD crew wasn’t sure of the motorcyclist’s condition, but they were relieved when Faubus moved his hand and asked for a drink of water. Pratt immediately radioed for help. Not far away were Sign Crew Supervisor Shannen Ray and worker Melissa Batt. They joined Bates and crew member Candice Russell in time to give Faubus water, clean the mud from his face and help comfort him. An ambulance arrived a short time later.

Faubus survived the accident and long wait for help to arrive by eating some grass. Arkansas State Police Trooper Jeff Harris believes cloudy skies and a heavy rainstorm also helped Faubus survive.

On arrival at Washington Regional Medical Center, doctors determined that Faubus had a broken neck and was paralyzed from the chest down. He had sustained injuries to his head, ribs and back as well. An MRI determined that Faubus had also suffered a heart attack. It is not known if the heart attack caused the accident or occurred while he laid waiting for someone to spot him in the grass.

The accident happened in June. Faubus survived his injuries, left the hospital and, today, is in therapy in Hot Springs. Though paralyzed from the chest down, doctors say it is amazing that he is already in therapy. His family says he is determined to become as independent as possible and looks forward to seeing his teenage son grow up.

“We are all thankful that Paul Pratt just happened to look in the right place that day,” added Shannen Ray.

The State and Public School Life and Health Insurance Board has posted a bounty for your health risk information. In an effort to identify active state employee health plan members that are at risk for disease, illness and injury, the Board has approved a voluntary Health Risk Assessment (HRA) questionnaire to be available this fall. The questionnaire has eleven questions about exercise habits, tobacco use, alcohol consumption, weight and seat belt use – nationally standardized questions that assess risk for disease or increased need for medical care. The following are sample questions from the survey:

*Have you ever smoked or used any of the following, check all that apply:*

*Cigarettes, Cigars, Pipe,  
Smokeless Tobacco or None*

Completion of the assessment is completely voluntary but there is a financial benefit. For each covered adult that responds, the health premium will be reduced by \$10 month. That's a \$120 reduction a year! If both employee and spouse are covered under the Plan and they each submit the assessment, their premium will be reduced by \$20 a month for a \$240 savings a year. If just one of the covered adults participates, or if there is just one adult covered under the Plan, the reduction will be \$10 a month.

The assessment will be available for completion online and via telephone automatic response system. All answers will be kept completely confidential, your agency will only know that you completed the assessment, not what the answers were. Information about how

to complete the assessment will be mailed to all active State employees that are members of a health plan soon. Surveys should be completed and submitted by September 30th in order for agency insurance representatives to have adequate time to make the payroll adjustments.

The Board's philosophy is if plan members are being encouraged to be healthier, then tools should be put in place to assist them. Health plan members the assessment identifies as having an increased health risk will be sent information with guidance on how to reduce their risk. Also, beginning October 1, 2004, the Employee Benefits Division (EBD) will implement a comprehensive tobacco use cessation program for employees and spouses covered under a state sponsored health plan. Health plan members will be eligible for 50% cost sharing on nicotine patches and bupropion (generic Wellbutrin). Counseling to address the emotional and behavioral aspects of stopping tobacco use is also a mandatory part of the program. Individual, group and telephonic counseling will be available through the current StarEAP program by Corphealth. Corphealth will also provide referrals to other smoking cessation services if desired. To enroll in the program, call the Arkansas Help Line at 1-866-378-1645.

The annual EBD publication, "Health Insurance Guide to Enrollment" will be sent to all active and retired state employees in September to prepare for the October open enrollment period. The booklet will include comprehensive information on all plan options, new benefit enhancements, new online enrollment options and more. Please make sure your agency has your current address and keep an eye out for your copy.

**DUTIES:**

My job involves mitigation and enhancements under the Special Studies Section of the Environmental Division. Wetland mitigation is the enhancement, restoration, creation, or preservation of wetlands as compensation for unavoidable impacts to wetlands.

**FAVORITE OR MOST INTERESTING PART OF YOUR JOB:**

Much of the job is wetland mitigation planning and monitoring. The Department owns more than 3,000 acres of wetland mitigation property, so I'm a land steward of a sort. Mitigation areas require annual monitoring and reports to the US Army Corps of Engineers.

We have a field crew, including Dan Kelly and Eric Sanders, who do much of the actual implementation of mitigation, like getting trees planted, putting up gates and signs, bird boxes and other stuff like that. You can find examples of their work on FHWA's wildlife website.<sup>1</sup>

The other side of the job is right-of-way enhancements including the wildflower program,<sup>2</sup> but I essentially just administer that - Donna Gardner does the real work and also keeps our plant nursery in order. Just this year she coordinated the rescue of four different species of sensitive plants from construction projects.



I also author the Natural and Visual Environment sections in our environmental documents, which may include plant surveys, and sometimes GIS land cover analysis. And, I review utility permits and other right-of-way permits for environmental constraints.

My favorite part of the job is when I'm doing botanical work - figuring out some plants - whether doing wetland monitoring, plant surveys, or looking at plants for the wetland delineation guys on staff.

**BACKGROUND:**

I have an AA in Mathematics from ASU-Beebe, B.S. in Education from the University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO), and a M.A. in Biology from UNO.

**FAMILY:**

I live in Sherwood. Divorced, no children.

**HOBBIES/INTERESTS:**

As far as hobbies go, right now I'm learning to play the guitar. My sister gave me one a couple months ago. It's not like I'm starting from scratch though, I was a musician for a few years out of high school - although some people may argue whether a drummer is a musician... anyway, I already knew the common chords and scales. I can play just well enough to entertain myself.
